State of New Hampshire v. Ian Bernard

Motion to Quash #2 / Response to Supplement to Motion to Show Cause

NOW COMES Ian Bernard to ask the Honorable Court to quash the Supplement to Motion to Show Cause filed by Eliezer Rivera, Police Prosecutor, claiming to represent the State of New Hampshire.

- 5. Mr. Bernard does not wish to be in an adversarial relationship with Mr. Rivera or the Keene Police Department. He is an upstanding individual who has better things to do than respond to unfounded allegations that appear to be targeted against him as a result of his being a media personality critical of the City of Keene. Mr. Bernard encourages Mr. Rivera and the Keene Police Department to pursue real criminals whose alleged crimes have a victim.
