**SUBJECT: US Army Reserve Command Force Protection Advisory 09-01 (U//FOUO)
November 22, 2008 - Planned Protests - "End the Fed!"**

1. (U//FOUO) The United States Army Reserve Command is publishing this Force Protection Advisory to advise all Army Reserve personnel of the planned protests at all Federal Reserve Banks and office locations within the United States on 22 November 2008. This message provides situational awareness and recommended mitigation measures.
2. (U) "Activists will demand an end to private banker control over the nation's money supply and return to a hard, commodity backed monetary system. The slogan is simple and direct: "End the Fed!" The November 22nd protests are intended as a kick-off to an ongoing campaign to educate and organize the public and take concerted, planned action. Only the conscious action of We the People can save the nation from ruin, plunder and total socialist tyranny. The time is NOW." 3. (U) The organizers for these planned protests have published the following conduct principles for participation. **ALL** End the Fed Organizing Groups and Participants **MUST** agree to the following principles:
 - Peaceful, Non-Violent Rally to Support Sound Money
 - Cooperation and respect for local laws and authorities
 - No harassment of Fed employees
 - No blocking of pedestrian or vehicular traffic
4. (U) Known Locations and Events: Protests will be held in the following 38 cities: Boston, Philadelphia, New York City, Buffalo, Cleveland, Cincinnati, Pittsburgh, Richmond, Baltimore, Charlotte, Atlanta, Birmingham, Jacksonville, Miami, Nashville, New Orleans, Chicago, Detroit, St. Louis, Little Rock, Louisville, Memphis, Minneapolis, Helena, Kansas City, Denver, Oklahoma City, Omaha, Dallas, El Paso, Houston, San Antonio, San Francisco, Los Angeles, Portland, Salt Lake City, Seattle, Washington, DC. 5. (U) Precautions. Be aware of your environment at all times. If you are verbally assaulted, do not retaliate by getting into a physical altercation. Whenever you can, call the local law enforcement authorities. Carry your cell phone.
6. (U//FOUO) Commanders are reminded at this time to exercise their Physical Security Plan, including all annexes. The Annexes concerning civil disturbances and communications with federal agencies and local law enforcement agencies should have increased emphasis due to upcoming protests scheduled throughout the country.

Commanders at all levels should established relationships with local police in order to understand the local threats. Commanders are encouraged to update alert rosters and review emergency evacuation plans/rally points. Ensure all facilities have emergency phone lists posted (FBI, FIRE, POLICE, HOSPITALS, EMS ETC). Commanders will ensure that Random Antiterrorism Measures (RAM) program is conducted as in integral part of their daily operations. RAM is particularly important due to the static nature of our forces and mission, which often result in the establishment of identifiable routines.

7. (U//FOUO) Report all potential protest activities to the Army Reserve Operations Center (AROC) listed in paragraph 8 below.

8. (U//FOUO) Commanders will closely monitor their local situations and have the authority to raise the local FPCON as necessary. Changes to FPCONs are to be transmitted through the chain of command to the Army Reserve Operations Center (AROC) IAW Para 6d, Annex G, USARC OPORD 2004-1 (Force Protection) and Para D-4, Appendix D, AR 525-13 (Antiterrorism). 9. (U//FOUO) Further information will be posted on the USARC Restricted Community page located on the Antiterrorism Enterprise Portal (ATEP), should it become available.

10. (U//FOUO). If you do not have an account enrolling into ATEP is very simple. 1) Go to: <https://atep.dtic.mil> <<https://atep.dtic.mil>> - this will take you to the initial Log In Page - on the left side bottom you will see "Need an account? Sign Up Now" - click on that and go through the registration process. 2) Once you have an account - you then go to "Communities" on the left side tool bar approx 3/4 of the way down. This is where you can request to enroll into the USARC restricted community.

(U//FOUO) Acknowledge receipt to the AROC. **REQUEST WIDEST DISSEMINATION POSSIBLE TO ALL COMMANDS, UNITS, AGENCIES, FACILITIES AND PERSONNEL.** Recipients may communicate information from this summary within their organizations to enhance awareness. If marked "FOUO," information is for official government use only. Items not marked "FOUO" may be shared with family members.
